In 2013 the Florida Chautauqua began took a step to solidifying its place in DeFuniak Springs. With the aquisition of the old Lakeside Hospital building to use as our headquarters. This historic building was the perfect choice for the association because of its location, space, and functional possibilities. The Association has worked to preserve and repair the ravages of time on the building. Opened

in 1939 as a single story clinic by Dr. Ralph Spires, the second floor was added in 1947. The building served as Walton Counties first certified hospital, and would remain open as such until 1972. After closing as a hosptial, the building continued to serve the community as Doctors offices. Today the building is being reevinsioned as location not only for the Florida Chautauqua Associations operations, history research library and museum, but also as a building the community can once again use. Board member Denise Mack has taken the lead on seeking grants to help revive the building. The most serious issue with the building is the roof. After meetings state officals, Denise

Historic items coming home.


You may not be aware, but at the Florida Chautauqua Lakeside Building, we maintain a history research library and archives. In recent years, Wallace Bruce's family has begun donating items to our library and archives from his estate. Most recently we received a large lot from his estate donated by his Great Granddaughter Madeleine and her husband John Oliver. Included in this lot were scrap books with photos of DeFuniak we have never seen, and Annie Bruce's, (Wallace Bruce's wife) scrap book with condolence letters she received after his death, as well as one of Wallace's personal scrap books. Also, Cindy Holt, Rusty Bowman, and Alfred Carlson, more of his Great Grandchildren, have donated items very important to our research and history of DeFuniak Springs and his time here. Wallace Bruce was our longest sitting President of the Florida Chautauqua and a loved citizen of DeFuniak Springs. These items can be viewed at the Florida Chautauqua Association museum and archives, and some are on loan to the Octagon House.

Has been able to identify the best options for grants to pursue. It is vital that we return this building to being one the community sees as a productive and important part of the community. We are still in the process of raising funds for the project, as for the larger grant we are pursuing, there is a match that we must provide. The sum is small compared to the amount of the grant, but is still a hill we must climb. Lakeside, like the Florida Chautauqua, has a strong history in the community. People have a strong emotional tie to this building, as many in the community were born here. We hope our efforts to preserve and revitalize Lakeside will preserve its place in DeFuniak Springs for the future.

The city of DeFuniak Springs has recently received a grant to update its survey of the Historic District. The Historic District is comprised largely of the old Florida Chautauqua Association grounds, where from 1885-1928, the Historic Florida Chautauqua operated.
